### **Admin Portal Update**

Starting in late
September, the INHALE
admin portal will be
separate from MCT2D.
Your log in credentials
will remain the same,
however the link to the
portal will be changed.
The CC will send out a
notification when this
change occurs.

# **Updates to 2025 VBR**

The 2025 INHALE PCP and SCP VBR scorecard which was worth a total of 105% will now be split into 103% and 102% (reimbursement period for 2025 SCP VBR is 03/01/25 – 02/28/26; 2025 PCP VBR is 09/1/25 – 08/31/26)

- PARTICIPATION will be worth 103% of the VBR and the measurement period will end 8/31/24 (as originally planned).
- PERFORMANCE will be worth 102%, aggregated at the PO level and will extend to 10/31/24 (2 months longer than originally planned).
- The performance target remains at increasing 5
  percentage points from your baseline score for
  Inhaler Education. This means if your baseline was
  1%, the target is 6%; this has not changed from the
  original release of the scorecard.
- NOTE: the Tobacco Cessation VBR (102%) measure details and measurement period will remain the same, with the measurement period ending 08/31/24.

The new measurement year (participation and performance) for 2026 VBR will still begin **9/1/24** and go through **8/31/25**.

# **COPD Research Study Opportunity**

<u>The RELIANCE study</u>, is a <u>PCORI-funded</u>, national clinical trial called comparing roflumilast to azithromycin head-to-head for treatment escalation in people with COPD. The results of the RELIANCE study are expected to inform hospital efforts to reduce re-admissions and premature deaths in individuals with COPD, and programs to reduce antibiotic overuse.

This study offers a unique, compensated opportunity for pulmonologists to get involved in research (without research infrastructure like a study coordinator) by simply referring their eligible patients to the study using a brief online form. The RELIANCE team consents and follows up with participants remotely.

### What is the RELIANCE COPD study?

**RELIANCE** is a multi-site, nationwide clinical research project funded by the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI) to compare the real-world effectiveness of long-term oral roflumilast vs. azithromycin to prevent COPD readmissions and mortality after hospital discharge.

#### What's in it for clinicians?

- **\$500 up front** to help get set up and each year the study is recruiting (currently scheduled through 2025).
- \$2000 for each participant enrolled if 1-2 patients per month join, this can really add up!
- RELIANCE supports with the IRB!
- Collaborate + attend webinars with leaders in COPD treatment, readmission prevention, & pulmonary care.

### 3 steps for clinicians to refer their patients to RELIANCE:



#### STEP 1

Identify potentially eligible patients during routine care (in-person or telehealth).

- Hospitalized for COPD exacerbation or respiratory complications of COVID-19 in the last 12 months:
- Have severe COPD with associated chronic bronchitis;
- ✓ Currently take a LAMA, ICS/LABA, or LAMA/LABA;
- May need treatment escalation with either roflumilast or azithromycin (and you have no preference).

### STEP 2

#### Introduce the RELIANCE study

RELIANCE provides materials to help introduce the study.

If patient expresses interest, confirm eligibilty and hand them an envelope of RELIANCE materials to support enrollment by the RELIANCE call center.

### STEP 3

Submit a 3-minute online referral form. RELIANCE takes it from there!

The RELIANCE call center confirms interest and eligibility.

A central study MD writes the first Rx and sends to your patient's pharmacy.

# **Air Quality Index Monitoring Tools**

Air Quality Index (AQI) can affect patients with lung conditions with asthma flares, increased coughing, and shortness of breath. AQI can also be raised during the summer wild fire season. Tracking this information can give patients insight into their breathing difficulties and when they may want to take extra caution to prevent flares.







# **Medication Updates**

# **Symbicort**

As of 8/1/24, Symbicort (brand) will be moved to the generic tier for patients with BCBSM commercial pharmacy benefits. Generic Symbicort (Breyna) will no longer be covered. According to BCBSM, a new prescription is not required and the change over for existing refills will occur at the pharmacy.

## **Inhaler Cost Reductions**

Some major asthma inhaler manufacturers have announced \$35 a month caps on out-of-pocket costs. The price cap will apply to people with commercial/private insurance or no insurance.
