Administrative Requirements	
Submit the name of the Clinical Champion and Practice Liaison	Each participating practice will be required to designate: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a Clinical Champion who will be responsible for disseminating performance, QI, and educational information to sites and helping to advance best practices; and a Practice Liaison who will work with the PO to ensure completeness and quality of data.
Communicate with the PO	Respond to inquiries and requests from the PO regarding participation in the collaborative.
Data Requirements	
Share required data elements with MiHIN	Work with PO to share required data elements for participation in INHALE with the Michigan Health Information Network (MiHIN) and other participants in the care and care improvement process in accordance with established HIPAA and other regulatory data sharing standards.
Provide additional data fields, as necessary.	Submit additional data as needed in addition to the data that will be submitted automatically/electronically to the coordinating center.
Provide data for social determinants of health.	Share social determinants of health data for individuals with asthma and COPD with the coordinating center.
Allow data to be used in publications.	Facilitate consent for data and information acquired to be analyzed for use in peer-reviewed publications to further advance QI efforts.

Focus on INHALE's five chosen quality initiatives.	Assist with educating others about quality initiatives and the development of quality improvement plans for incorporating the following principles: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Improved accuracy in the diagnosis of both Asthma and COPD with spirometry Increase patient education on appropriate inhaler use and technique. Reduce the number of short-acting-beta-agonists (SABA prescriptions via education on overuse and adherence to maintenance therapies

	<p>4. Decreasing oral corticosteroid (OCS) reliance via education on overuse.</p> <p>5. Increase utilization of pulmonary rehabilitation after COPD hospitalization.</p>

INHALE Speaker Series – INHALE will host 4 speakers during the calendar year; practice Clinical Champions are required to attend 1 session/year.
